- **Learn about the endangered woodlands of NSW. (Did you know they stretch all the way down the inland tablelands and slopes of NSW from Queensland to Victoria, are one of the most important ecosystems for agriculture in NSW and in some places less than 10% remains?)**
- **Find out more about Australian plants and animals that rely on woodlands for their survival.**
- **Hear from scientists working with endangered Australian woodland species.**
- **Join in the Threatened Species Day broadcast where our scientists will answer student's questions about threatened plants and animals.**

- Four scientists talk about their work with threatened woodlands, mammals, frogs and reptiles, flora and birds, why some species are threatened and the sort of actions that can be taken to improve their chances of survival.
